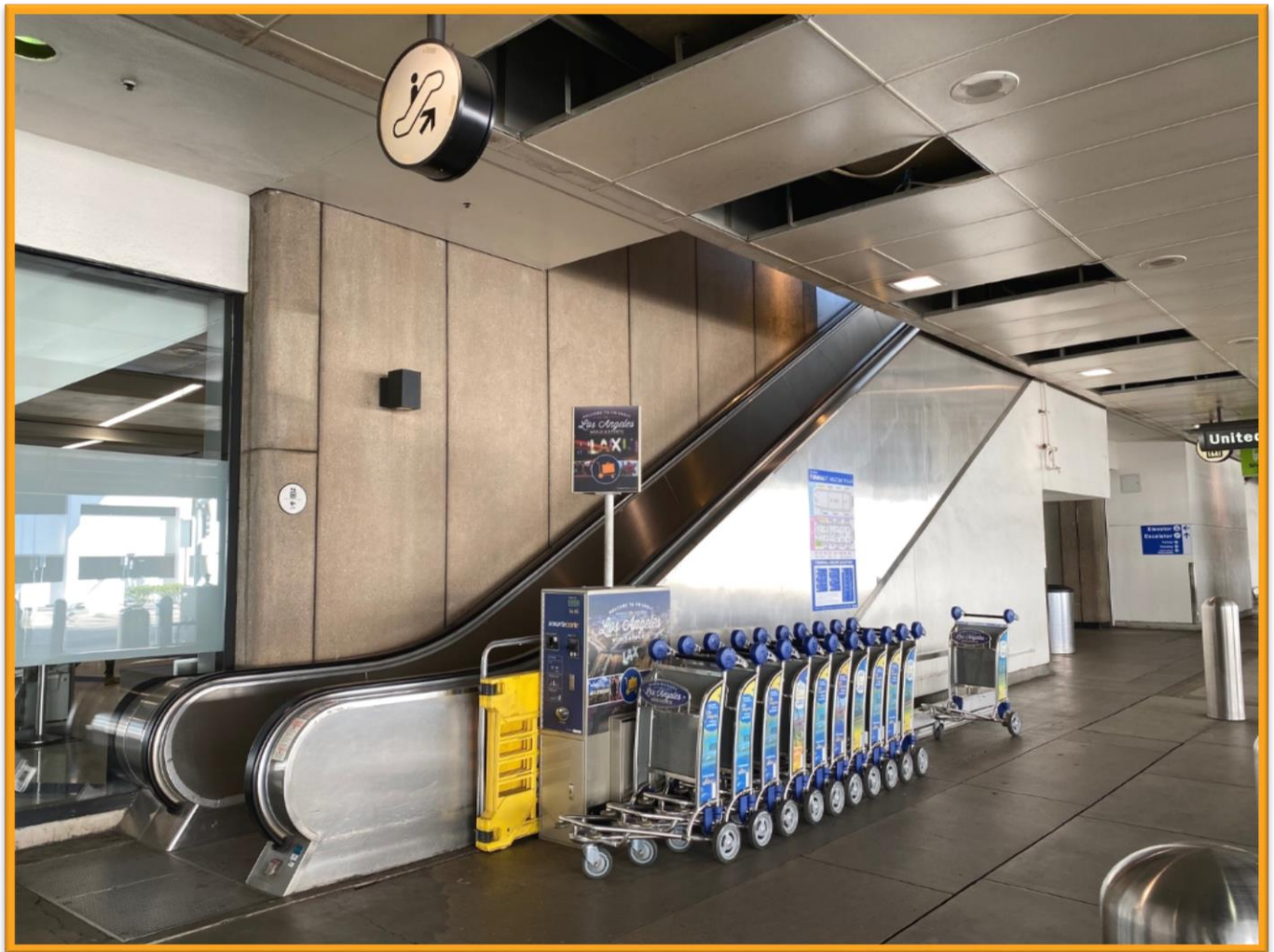


Construction Hot Topics

1. Terminal 7: Escalator Demolition

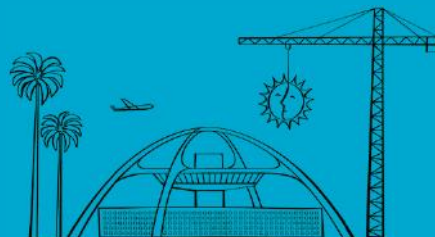
- Barricades will be built this week in advance of the demolition of Escalator 1 at Terminal 7, which goes from Gate Level to Arrivals Level
- Once the escalator is demolished as part of the Terminal 7 Core & APM Interface project, temporary stairs will be built in its place, scheduled to be complete by the end of March 2020
- Signage will be posted directing guests to the nearest stairs and elevators during construction; Smarte Carte will be temporarily relocated

2. Surface Lot 2: Trailer Demolition (Former USO)

- To facilitate future construction of the Automated People Mover Guideway, trailers at Surface Lot 2 (former USO building north of Theme Building) have been demolished
- Upon completion of the demolition, crews will begin installing foundation piles and building falsework, which can currently be seen on Center Way between Parking Structures 1 & 7
- **Bob Hope USO moved to the LAX Theme Building in July 2018*



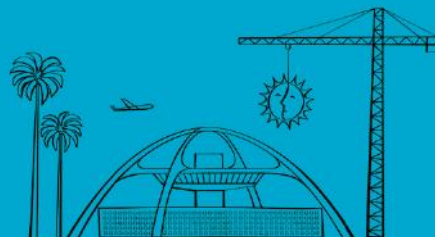
*Surface Lot 2 Trailer Demolition

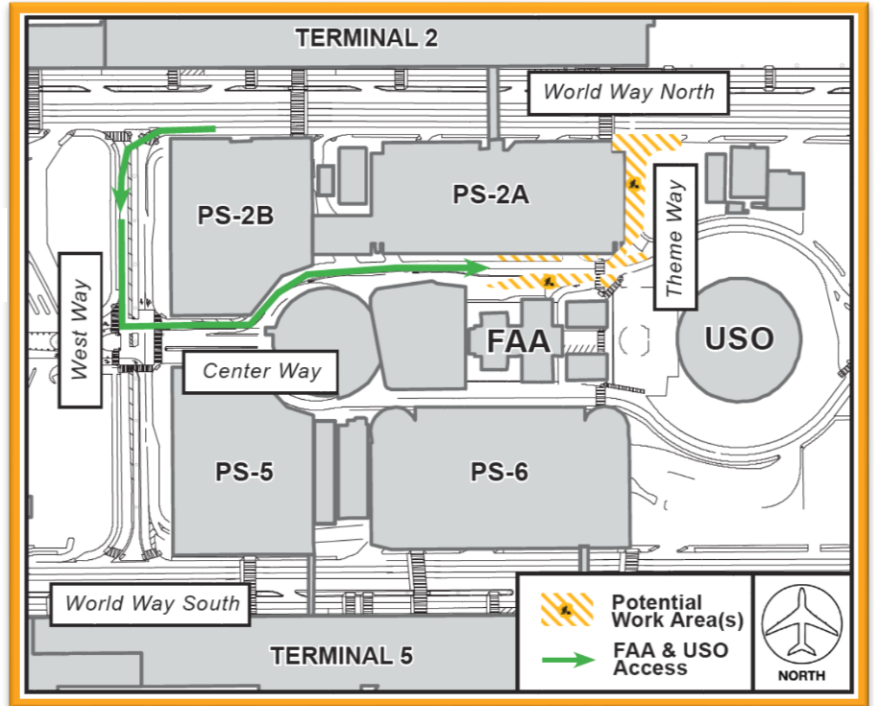

3. CTA Lane Restrictions: Theme Way, Center Way

- Underground utility work for SoCal Gas will close Theme Way and restrict portions of Center Way nightly (1AM to 7AM) through March 23, 2020
- Pedestrian traffic will be maintained and vehicular traffic will be detoured; signage will be in place

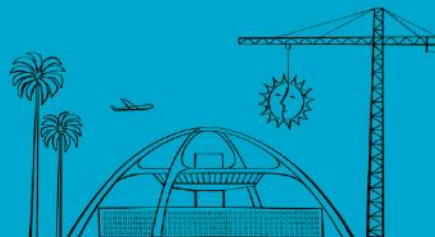
Map: Scheduled nightly lane closures / restrictions

4. Construction Update: Terminal 1.5

- Construction continues airside on the Terminal 1.5 building with exterior finishes already installed (pictured below, bottom photo)
- Next, work will be to install exterior finishes on the front of the building (facing the CTA roadways, helping it look more like the finished rendering (pictured below, top photo))
