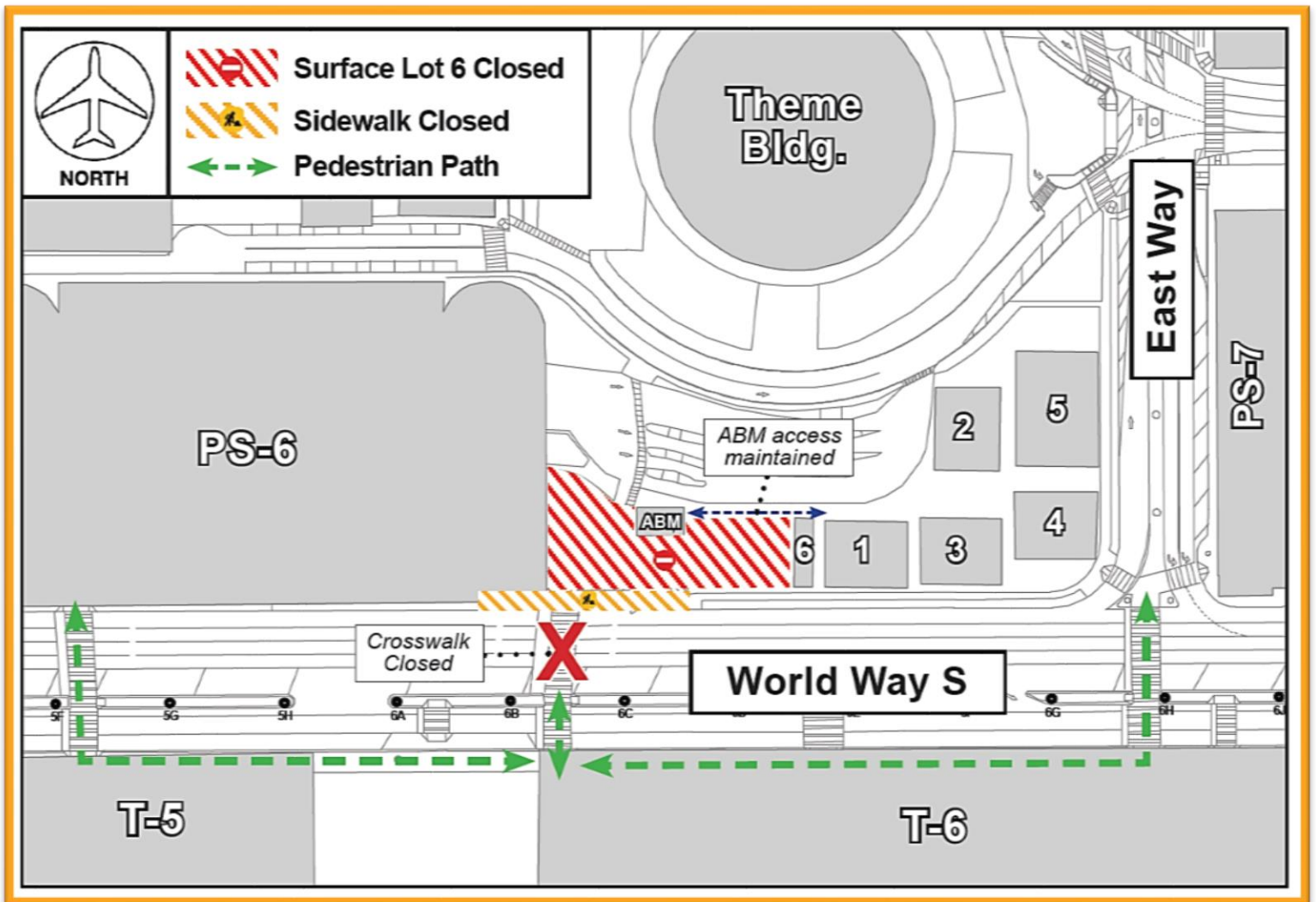

1. Terminal 6: Arrivals Level Pedestrian Detours

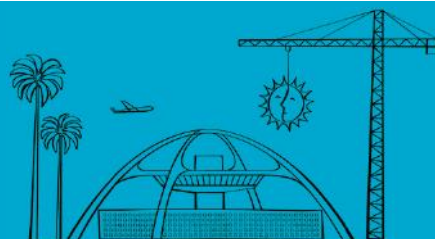
- The Automated People Mover (APM) project will close the crosswalk between Terminal 6 and Parking Structure 6 beginning October 17 continuous through October 23 to facilitate foundation work
- Flaggers will be present and detour signage will be in place directing guests to the next available crosswalks
- Access to the Pedestrian Pick-Up Curb will be maintained at all times; no shuttle stops are impacted by this work

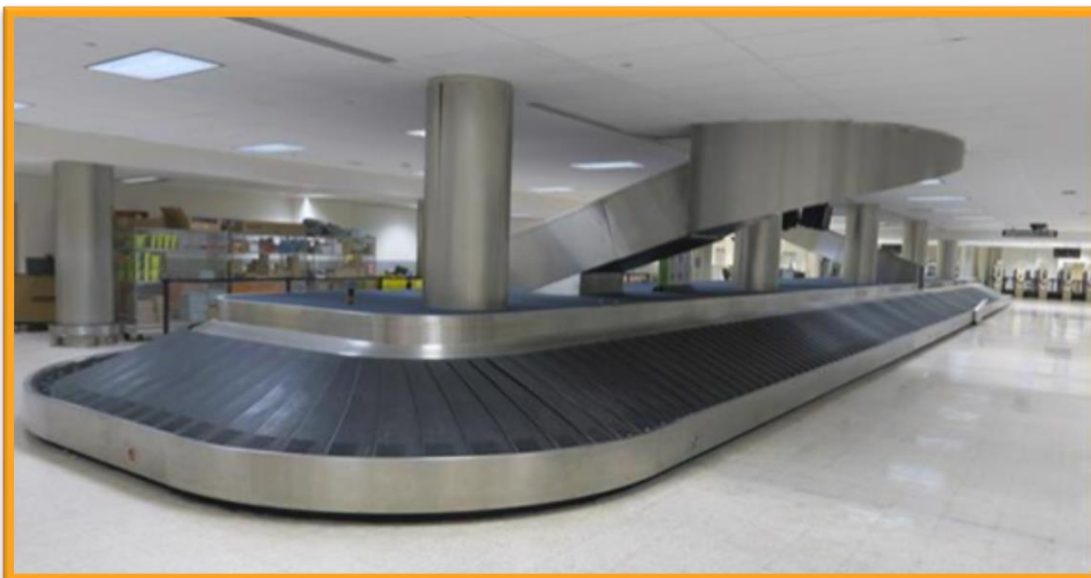

2. Terminal 2 / 3: Construction Update

- Construction of the Terminal 2 / 3 head house continues with the help of two airside tower cranes as part of the Delta Sky Way program (pictured below, top)
- Also pictured below (top), the Pedestrian Bridge between Parking Structure 3 and Terminal 3 is scheduled to be demolished in November 2020; to facilitate this and other construction, Terminal 3 remains closed to the public
- Pictured below (bottom), Terminal 2 bag claim is scheduled to temporarily move to the former customs area later this fall; watch Construction Hot Topics for updates

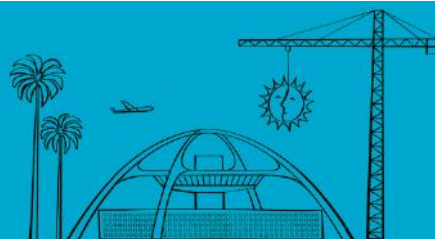
*Terminal 2 / 3 Head House

3. Airline Gate 131 Re-Opening

- Airline Gate 131 in Terminal B's North Concourse, which has been closed since April 2017, is scheduled to re-open this week on October 15 (previously reported to re-open late July 2020)
- The gate was closed to facilitate work for the Midfield Satellite Concourse – North (MSC) Project
- Also scheduled to re-open this week is Airline Gate 26 in Terminal 2, which has been closed since September 2020
